Required Textbook & Materials

You must obtain: *Mosaicos (Custom Edition for SUNY Plattsburgh)* referred to as [T] in the course calendar and have a **MySpanishLab.com** account for the online Student Activity Manual. This is the same textbook that was required for Spanish 111. You are expected to have the textbook at every class session. You will also be completing Student Activity Manual exercises online that require the purchase of a MySpanishLab.com subscription. **You are required to have the textbook and online access to the Student Activity Manual exercises from day one of the semester. Failure to acquire these materials will not excuse any student from completing any assignment nor grant an extension of time for turning in assignments.**

Course Description & Structure

This is a second semester course beginning at the end point of Spanish 111. As such, the prerequisite is Spanish 111 or the equivalent. This is not an introductory course. **Students are expected to have mastered the essentials of Spanish 111.** The main objective of the course is to develop proficiency in the areas of listening, speaking, reading, and writing in the Spanish language. Class meets twice a week at the time and location indicated in the Master Schedule.

Preparation, Participation, and Attendance in Class

It is the student's responsibility to **prepare textbook material before coming to class**. This includes reading the grammatical explanations and learning the relevant vocabulary by whatever method works best for that individual student. Class time will be spent on practicing the textbook content with summary presentations of grammar topics. This does not mean that questions should not be brought up in class. I encourage each student to ask questions when appropriate or contact me outside of class time when having difficulty.

Students are required to actively participate in class activities. A student who is not in class, obviously, cannot participate in that day's activities. Therefore, students are expected to attend all class meetings. Students are allowed **two absences without automatic penalty**. Each absence over 2 will result in a one point reduction of the final semester grade.

****All absences count regardless of reason****

Every three late-arrivals or early departures constitute 1 absence in computing the final semester grade. Absences occasioned by University-sponsored activities or religious holidays for which appropriate paper work has been presented **AHEAD OF TIME**, will permit make-up or late submission of an **assignment**. **Total absences of 7 or more will result in a failing grade for the course.**

Testing

There will be five lesson quizzes and a final exam. The quizzes will be given at the end of lessons in the textbook. Lesson quizzes will include a listening comprehension portion. Late arrival on the day of a quiz will result in the forfeiture of points for any listening comprehension items already read. There will also be **un-announced vocabulary quizzes** throughout the semester based on the words and expressions **IN THE TEXTBOOK** on the pages listed for that specific day in the Course Calendar. **THERE ARE NO MAKEUP QUIZZES OR EXAMS.** An absence on the day of a test will result in a grade of zero for that particular test. At the end of the semester the lowest quiz score will be dropped.
